	<ul> <li>David Korman: Will there be changes to make the hotel energy efficient? Yes, they have started by doing a lot of patching work to make sure A/C isn't being wasted and also looking into using electric for water.</li> </ul>						
	<ul> <li>Julian Dorcelien: Do you have experience with gay communities? Yes.</li> </ul>
